Fight or flight is a common life choice. It is the situation in which we must either run from or become confrontational in conflict. Examples of fight or flight situations are numerous and include relationships, work environments, and emotional growth experiences. Choices to run rather than fight are in many of our histories as most of us have come from immigrant stock. Our mothers and/or fathers (or their fathers or mothers, etc.) chose to leave hard times rather than confront issues.

I lived many years of my life in a neighborhood most other Dutch Christian Reformed members chose to flee, leaving decimated property, values and abandoned friends. More recently a common story told is the decision to flee a school system.

Some of us have even fled family with its dysfunction and conflict.

Fight or flight often seems to leave us with no good option – especially for those of us who dislike conflict and do not have a good grasp on how to deal with conflict in a healthy way.

David, in Psalm 11, is in a fight or flight situation. The reality that seems to complicate David's situation is that humanly speaking he doesn't appear to have the resources to fight. He is left, so it appears, with only one option – to "flee like a bird to your mountain." (vs. 1). Yet, David will not. Instead he states, "In the LORD I take refuge." (vs 1).

David is clear on a number of realities – first and foremost is that God is on the throne. He has not abdicated nor is His position as King of Kings in danger of being lost or successfully challenged. "The LORD is in his holy temple; the LORD is on his heavenly throne." (vs. 4).

The second reality for David is when God has called him and given him a responsibility or calling it is not primarily his (David's) responsibility to defend himself. Rather, when God calls, God defends. Therefore, David could remain confident that in the midst of danger and threats he could rest securely in God's promises and work.

The question with which I am left after reading Psalm 11 is, "To what has God called me that I find myself wanting to flee because of hardship, adversaries or difficult situations?" If God has called you God will defend. If God has called, God will equip.

Some of God's greatest gifts come in the midst of the temptation to flee, to go for the easier option. David reminds us that we can live confidently because God continues on His throne.
